Pastors at St. Boniface Parish

The first priests to service the mission of St. Boniface Parish were S.J. (Jesuits). Their missionary district was chiefly Waterloo County, but also covered all Western Ontario to Goderich, St. Thomas and the Lake Erie shores to Niagara Falls. These priests would bless births, marriages and deaths. They were stationed in St. Agatha and only visited on their way through.

- Rev. John Louis Wiriath 1834 Born in Alsace and came to Canada in 1834
- Rev. Peter Schneider 1837 Born in lower Alsace and came to Canada in 1830
- Rev. John Louis Wiriath1844
- Rev. Simon Sanderl 1844 Born in Bavaria and came to Canada in 1844
- Rev. Anton Schmid 1844 Born in Bavaria and came to Canada in 1844
- Rev. Louis Caveng 1847 Born in Switzerland and came to Canada in 1847. Father Caveng called a meeting and it was decided to begin work on a new church. "New Germany mission had a poor old log church-school".
- Rev. Bernard Fritsch 1847 Born in Bavaria and came to Canada in 1847. Father recorded Baptisms – Oct. 1847, Marriage April 1847 and Death August 1847.

Very Rev. John Holzer 1848 A native of Austria and came to New Germany in 1848 to 1852. "He built or finished many churches including New Germany". Was the first resident priest.

Rev. John Baptist Baumgartner 1852 A native of Alsace and came to New Germany 1852 – 1856. "Under his administration a splendid bell was secured."

Rev. Dr. J. A. Arnold 1856 A native of Switzerland and came to New Germany in 1856. "Was a man of great learning but was often sick." Rev. Edward. Glowacki C.R. 1860 A native of Prussia. He was the first ordination in the County at St. Agatha Church, St. Agatha, Ontario. Came to New Germany in 1860.

Rev. Frances X. Rassaerts 1864 A native of Holland. Came to New Germany in 1864.

Rev. Frances Breitkopf CR 1865
A native of Prussia and came to New Germany in 1865. "He organized the St. Boniface Society for men to work by word and example to influence the youths of the parish in their morals and manners. In 1866 he took the most systematic and complete census of the parish – taken down number, sex, age condition of every individual, the size of the farm and its condition, the character of the father, etc." He also "erected the fine brick rectory beside the church. He began preparation for the building of a new church, the old one have become too small, though being still in good repair and condition."

- Rev. E. Glowacki CR 1872 Returned to New Germany in 1872
- Rev. C. Niemann 1873
 Native of Germany and came to New Germany in 1873. "In his last two years he built the new church (St. Boniface) on the site of the old one. The erection of the church was an easy matter for him, but the payment for it was more difficult."

Very Rev. Stephen Foerster 1878 Born in Prussia and came to New Germany in 1878. The church at its completion was \$11,000.00, besides what had been paid for while under construction. He baptized, married and buried many of his parishioners.

Rev. Dean Joseph. F. Wey 1924 Born in St. Agatha, Ontario. Became assistant pastor 1924. His family was one of the early settlers in St. Agatha.
